- Eligibility exclusions exist
- Leverages Home Energy Report procedural approach (where applicable) and examples from other jurisdictions
- Procedural measure with a population NMEC type approach
 - Opt-out program
 - Randomized Control Trial (RCT), differencein-difference approach
- Business Energy Reports provided to influence:
 - Behavioral changes or practices that affect equipment use
 - Behavioral changes in the purchase and installation of primarily low-cost equipment

Business Energy Reports

Vs Prior BER Programs

- Reduced Reliance on Peer Comparison
- Longer Duration to Enable Ramp
 Up
- Increased Population Size
- Use a stratified sampling approach to randomly select the treatment and control groups

Issues and Comments – Measure Screening Committee (MSC)



Proposal Review Comments from the Cal TF - MSC

- Strategy needed to reconcile double-counted savings
 - HER program evaluates overlap at the end of the year.
 - Communication between programs will need to be established.
 - PA EM&V process is a key part of this.
- Concern over the need to establish equivalent control and treatment groups
 - Question whether to establish groups by climate, business type, consumption level, etc – expected large heterogeneity in groups as opposed to residential program.
- X Maintain a statewide approach to this measure
 - Initially, the measure will be piloted/focused in SCE territory.
 - After refining it could be expanded to other territories.
